

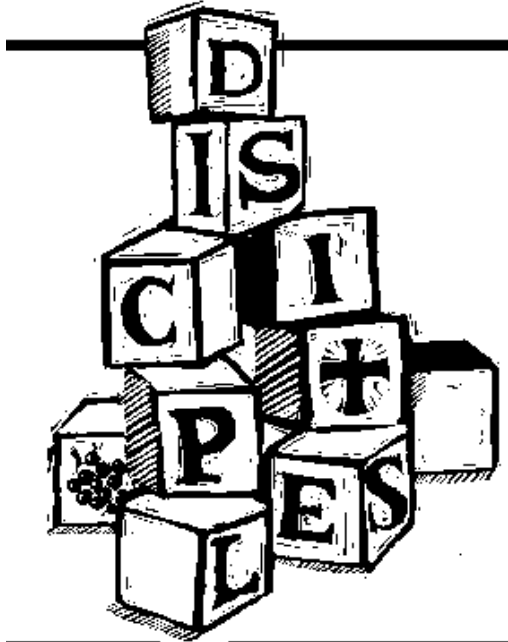

Christian Fellowship

We are a community of believers who embrace the practice of fellowship. Do you know that fellowship is more than the time we spend catching up, sipping warm coffee after the Sunday morning worship service? It begins with our relationship with God and branches out as a result of that relationship. Fellowship is caring for God's creation. It is something that is shared by faithful Christians all over the world.

"Fellowship with the family of God and with God Himself is one of the greatest blessings of being a Christian."

Fellowship comes from the Greek word *Koinonia*, which means "to share in common." It is translated in the King James Bible as communion (1 Corinthians 10:16), communicate (Hebrews 13:16), or contribution (Romans 15:26). "All three usages suggest commonality of purpose, partnership and interest". According to scripture, fellowship is not an optional matter for believers. "If we walk in the light (in fellowship with God)... this causes us to have fellowship with one another." (1 John 1:7).

Christian fellowship fosters trust, hope, a sense of belonging, faith, patience, selflessness, and an unconditional love that comes from people who have a personal relationship with God. It's all about relationship.

Here at LUMC we witness an abundance of Christian fellowship. It's been and continues to be a vital part of this faith community and it begins at an early age! The **KAN kids** meet monthly under the direction of Bonnie Blair to learn about service organizations and to serve others. At one of their meetings Peg MacKenzie and Janette Reeves spoke about the Church World Service Kit Program. KAN assembled 300 Church World Service kits. The kits are sent all over the world to aid people in need. KAN also continues to raise funds for the Nothing But Nets Program. To date 100 malaria nets

have been purchased. Locally, KAN participates in transporting Food Pantry groceries to the residents at Woodsedge. These young Christians also make time to spend an occasional Sunday afternoon spreading cheer and playing games with Woodsedge residents. This is Christian fellowship at its best!

You are invited to participate in some upcoming fellowship events. On Thursday evenings join us for a new **short-term bible and book study** with Pastor Jane. The group meets weekly at 7:00 PM in the adult Sunday School classroom and topics are mutually agreed upon.

Watch for the rescheduled **Ladies' Love Feast and Salad Supper** with Dianne Walter hosting (originally set for early February). Dianne writes:

"The Gift of Love comes 'wrapped' in many different 'packages,' comes to us at various times over the course of our lives, and communicates different messages in varying ways and circumstances. Over the past 45+ years the gift of love through the lives of our women have blessed many, and we don't often take the time to reflect on this and find ways to show appreciation for the ways in which God's love has come to us through the living testimonies of our Sisters in Christ.

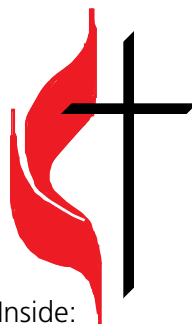
