

# Staff Summer Schedule



This 30-week class focuses on the portraits of Jesus found in the four Gospels, looking at the way each Gospel writer presents events and teachings and at the picture of Jesus that emerges in each of the Gospels.

Disciple Bible Studies provide in-depth and powerful insight into God's beautiful handbook. Designed for daily study, they also provide a disciplined approach for including the Bible into our daily lives, enriching us beyond belief. Classroom time is a small group seminar to discuss each week's lesson, with a short video presentation by Biblical scholars. Time is devoted to delving into the passages studied for the week, as well as considering how these passages speak to our own practice of discipleship. This study is the first in a new series called DISCIPLE Second Generation Studies.
