From the Pastor

Out of Your Comfort Zone and Into God's Zone

↑ few weeks ago, I was invited to join the AIthaca Community Chorus SummerSing program. I thought I would be going with (or meeting there) someone from LUMC. Much to my surprise, that person was otherwise engaged that evening and I found myself in a room full of strangers—not one familiar face! My first instinct was to turn around and run...but I decided that I could be a grown-up (just this once) and tough it out. I was—and still am—glad that I did. While I can't say I have "made new friends" just yet, I have moved out of my comfort zone with positive results. As hard as it was—and is—for me to break through my fears and apprehensions, I am enjoying the music immensely.

I believe the same is true for the church. We are a vital and thriving congregation that needs to move into some areas that might be a little uncomfortable for some. As we approach a time to celebrate fifty years of ministry here at LUMC, we need to think

long and hard about where we want to be fifty years from now. We may be moving into unfamiliar territory, we may be working with people we don't know really well—yet. We may be seeing more and more new faces in positions of leadership. We will be dealing with tougher economic realities. What facility needs are there? What ministry needs are there? What are we doing that we could do better? What aren't we doing that needs to be done? Where is God pushing us? Where is God pulling us back?

As we struggle with these questions—and it will be a struggle—we will be pushed out of our comfort zones. My prayer is that we, as a congregation, will not turn around and run, but will tough it out...and see what God will do with us. We need to listen to where God is calling us and trust that the outcome will be positive, perhaps even enjoyable!!


Church Camp: Camperships Are Available

VBS Mission Project: Nothing But Nets

Please start saving your pocket change for the VBS Mission Project. Every year our VBSers contribute to a mission project to make our community and world a better place—more like God wants for us. This time, our ocean-theme of Operation Overboard led us to look to help out our world with nets, specifically mosquito nets. Our Kids in Action Now will be sharing information about "Nothing But Nets." The VBS kids



will have a chance to learn about why malaria is a devastating problem and how they can help stamp out malaria, protecting one family at a time. Every \$10 we collect buys a net, gets it to where it is needed, and provides education on how to use it effectively. The nets are laced with pyrethrins, which are derived from chrysanthemums. Harmless to people, but deadly for mosquitoes. Every net can save a family of four! One idea to generate donations is to set aside the money you get back for deposit can and bottles between now and VBS. At our church services and during VBS, we'll be setting out a "net" to put donations in. If you'd like to join in, please look for the donation box on Sundays and throw in some spare change or slips for deposit cans and bottles. Thank you for all of your support!
