Reflections on Advent

I'm tired. Really, really tired. Bone tired. Is this the way to start the season? It scares me to recognize that I'm starting out tired...how will I feel later in the month? Will I be able to keep up? Will I get everything done?

What if I can't? What if I'm just too overwhelmed....WHOA!!!!! Is this what the coming of the Christ-child is all about?

Let us just *stop* all the frenzy and take time to rest in the arms of God, trusting God to take care of the details.

We forget so quickly that the season of Advent is not about shopping and baking, but about reflecting and seeking.

We get so caught up in the culture that we think we are too busy to take time for ourselves and God to commune. I suggest that you (and I) make a daily appointment with God during Advent. Take some special time to listen to the rhythm of your heart and life in concert with God.

When I have been conscientious enough to take time to be with God, I have found that the things that truly exhaust me fall away. I find myself energized. I find myself revitalized. I find myself renewed. So, perhaps this little article is not written so much for you as it is for me! Take cues from your own spirits...God is waiting to tell you what to do.

As for me...well, I just took some time to read a poem, one that I will share with you, and then I intend to journal on its implications for my life in the next few weeks. I have taken the liberty of making this poem more inclusive of us all...

In our secret yearnings we wait for your coming, and in our grinding despair we doubt that you will.

UMCOR helps with typhoon and tornadoes

Eleven days after the November 8 typhoon, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) delivered 800 food packages to residents in Tacloban, Philippines. UMCOR is also working in the midwest after tornadoes left widespread damage on November 17. Donations for food and supplies will be really helpful, as will assembling school and health kits.

This emergency response in the Philippines and midwest is made possible by your donations to UMCOR during One Great Hour of Sharing. To help with the long-term recovery, you can donate to either location or to UMCOR generally. For the Philippines, write a check to LUMC, memo: International Disaster Response, UMCOR Advance #982450. for the tornadoes, memo US Disaster Response Advance #901670. As always, 100% of the money goes where you designate. UMCOR takes no overhead. We cover that with One Great Hour of Sharing.
