"Lord, Is It I?" Will Be Presented Two Nights during Holy Week

On Tuesday, March 31, and Maundy Thursday, April 2,

the Lenten play "Lord, Is It I?," by Ernest K. Emurian will be presented in the Lansing United Methodist Church sanctuary at 7:30 p.m.. Following the play, Holy Communion will be served. "Lord, Is It I?" is set in the upper room as Leonardo da Vinci portrayed it in his painting The Last Supper. Each disciple reflects on his life with Jesus and ponders Jesus' statement that one of them will betray him. A nursery will be provided on Thursday.

Passover Seder at LUMC Friday, April 3, 6:00 p.m.

Passover was one of the most important holidays that Jesus would have celebrated during his lifetime. Many believe that the Last Supper was a Passover Seder. The Seder is a special family meal filled with ritual to remind us that God delivered his people out of slavery and brought them to the Promised Land. All are welcome. Those that are comfortable doing so are asked for a \$10 donation per person to cover the cost of the meal. No one should stay away. Your presence is needed more than your presents.

Lansing Youth Mission in Guatemala (Trip One)



he Lansing Youth Mission group spent a week in Guatemala in February working with Unbound. A second LYM group will go to Guatemala during Holy Week. The LYM group donated enough to build a house near San Lucas Toliman for a 12-year-old boy, Marvin, and his grandparents who raised him. Although a Cornell student group led by Andra Benson built a stove and donated a new roof, there were many open spaces simply covered with thin plastic, and the walls were still coated in creosote from the open fires inside.

The LYM group helped to carry gravel, mix and pour the concrete floors, finish the roof and install the windows and doors. The mason and his two sons, with Marvin and his grandfather, could have probably completed it more quickly without our group "helping," but we learned how much could be accomplished with branches cut from trees with machetes. Marvin also celebrated his 13th birthday that day with his first meal at a restaurant and first birthday cake.

The LYM group swondered why a police truck constantly followed them, but discovered that it was the free escort given by the tourism department. The kids soon made friends and were allowed to ride in the back of the police truck on the shorter trips. The group also met their sponsored children and visited churches, markets and families in Santiago, Patzun, San Lucas, San Pedro and Antigua. LYM would like to thank all of those in the area who made this trip possible. You not only contributed to building a house for a young boy, but many have inspired our youths to careers in the foreign service or languages.—*Christine Montague*, *excerpted from Lansing Town Talk*.
