Worship in the Park

During the month of July, LUMC services are held in Myers Park, just down the road from church. We're in Pavilion D, which is to the left after you pass the entry booth. Look for the green "Welcome to Worship" banner. We meet rain or shine, so make sure to dress for the weather. (Usually it's just beautiful down there.)

There's plenty of seating on the picnic tables, but many people like to bring their folding chairs, for comfort or just because.

If you'd like to help out a bit, there's a need for people to haul bulletins, offering baskets, and the sound system. It's usually good for someone to arrive early to make sure the pavilion is reasonably tidy and the tables are where they should be. Plus, everyone appreciates goodies after the service. So let the office know if you want to help out on a Sunday.

As shown on the map above, from the church, head on down Ridge Rd (34B northbound) to the four corners and turn left on Myers Road. Follow that down through another four corners and across the railroad tracks. Bear right into the town park and turn left after you pass the booth. When you get to the booth just tell the booth attendant that you're there for church (if you're not a Lansing resident), and there's no charge for entry. The pavilion will be on your left. If you get to the lake, you have gone too far! If you have mobility concerns, don't be shy, drive right up to the pavilion.

New Church Office Hours Beginning in July

Church office hours are changing beginning in July. Monday through Thursday will still be 9:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m. Fridays will now be 9:00 a.m.–Noon. The church office will be closed on Friday, July 3, for Independence Day.
