From the Pastor

Transitions

The at Lansing United Methodist Church are in the middle of many transitions! Exciting milestones in our LUMC Forward Building Project include:

- January 29, at 10:15 a.m., we held a Church Conference to vote final approval of project plans, cost estimate, and funding plan (join us if you are reading this before that time); and
- February 5, 9:00 a.m., Worship Celebration, including Blessing of the Shovels, Commissioning of 2017 Confirmation Class, and guest preacher Rev. Bill Gottschalk-Fielding.

In the middle of this construction project, children are growing up, adults are growing older, and all of us growing in our need for grace as we respond to new situations.

Change is inevitable. How we deal with transitions in our lives is a spiritual issue: do we respond with fear or with faith?

Part of being the church is helping people through life's transitions. We grow in grace as we learn to walk with one another through both celebratory and difficult times.

The church offers rituals to mark some transitions. For example, each Sunday we give thanks for God's gift of the week that is past, and accept the gift of a new week in which to live.

Recognizing that change is happening brings tremendous potential for revitalization and new life. The spiritual issue is how we choose to respond to these opportunities.

Church members support one another through transitions with prayers, community, and the wisdom of our Christian scriptures, tradition, reason, and lived experience. We gather together to find God's comfort, healing, and direction as individuals and as a community, experiencing God's promise to be with us wherever two or more gather in Jesus' name.

I invite you to hear the counsel of Esther's uncle Mordecai as part of a spiritual mentor's invitation to you: "Who knows? Maybe it was for a moment like this that you came to be part of the royal family" (Esther 4:14b).

United Methodist Volunteers in Mission

Supported by the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), the Volunteers in Mission are active at many disaster sites across the country and around the world.

LUMC's Adult Mission team plans a VIM trip to South Carolina in May to help with recovery after floods that damaged a wide area in October 2015. That seems like a long time ago, but recovery work takes a long time, first to clean up the mess and then to help people rebuild. The 2015 flood was labeled a 1,000-year flood, and it occurred just two years after what had been called a 100-year flood. The rain storm dropped well over 3 1/2 inches of rain. In the hamlet of North, South Carolina, on the edge of the Low Country just south of Columbia, a microburst toppled 40 trees onto homes and vehicles during the flood.

UMVIM emergency response teams came in from Georgia and North Carolina after the storm to begin stablizing the damaged structures and assess damage. Over 40 United Methodist churches were flooded.

Starting late in 2015, teams came in to continue mucking out the damage and begin the repair work. By that time, United Methodist volunteers had already contributed 12,000 hours of their time. Our team hopes to add to that recovery total.

The United Methodist connection makes this effort possible. Over 7,000 cleaning buckets and over 2,000 health kits had been distributed as of June 2016. Through UMCOR, more than \$500,000 in donations had been received by that time.

South Carolina is far from the only place where VIM teams are working, supported by UMCOR. Locations include Detroit (2014 flood), the Mississippi Delta area and St. Louis (March 2016 flood), and numerous locations in Virginia (February 2016 tornadoes). Work also continues in New Jersey for Superstorm Sandy recovery, where LUMC teams have gone three times, and in Fort Plain, Herkimer, and Oneida, New York, which have been struck by several floods. UMCOR will soon be working in Alabama and Georgia.

LUMC's Adult Mission team always welcomes new members, but if time does not permit, you can also make a donation to UMCOR for disaster recovery. Every dime of every donation goes to its intended purpose. There is no "overhead cost." The easiest way to donate is to write a check to LUMC and put UMCOR disaster response on your memo line. You can also pick a particular project or area. Indiana and West Virginia are still working to organize their volunteer response, for example. Or you can also support the UMC emergency supply depots, Sager-Brown, in Louisiana, and UMCOR-West, in Salt Lake City. The depots also welcome volunteers to assemble, verify, and distribute emergency kits and supplies.
